



1. Approval of Minutes

Connor Thompson made a motion to approve the minutes from the Regular Board meeting on Tuesday September 9, 2025, as read. Gregg Dale seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed and none abstained.

- **A.** Kevin provided the Board with a copy of the CWCR (Current Cash Working Capital Reserve), Water Revenue to Water working Capital Reserve Savings Account for FY 2025-2026 and discussed. After discussion, Connor Thompson made a motion to approve the CWCR (Current Cash Working Capital Reserve, Water Revenue to Water working Capital Reserve Savings Account for FY 2025-2026. Gregg Dale seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed and none abstained.
- **B.** Kevin provided the Board with a copy of the CWCR (Current Cash Working Capital Reserve), Sewer Revenue to Sewer working Capital Reserve Savings Account for FY 2025-2026 and discussed. After discussion, Connor Thompson made a motion to approve the CWCR (Current Cash Working Capital Reserve, Sewer Revenue to Sewer working Capital Reserve Savings Account for FY 2025-2026. Gregg Dale seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed and none abstained.

2. Signing of Checks

Connor Thompson made a motion to approve the Check Signed Document dated 9/11/25 through 10/14/25. Gregg Dale seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed and none abstained.

3. Phase IIIB Sewer Project

Zack informed the Board that he had the 9th Payment Request for the Phase IIIB Sewer Collection System Upgrades Project. After discussion, Connor Thompson made a motion to approve Resolution #9 for the Phase IIIB Sewer Project, with \$3,500.00 going to JD Utility Services, LLC; with \$30,073.00 going to Thrasher Engineering; and \$372,362.86 going to Pro Contracting Inc., for a grand total of \$405,935.86 to be submitted to WVDEP (SRF) and the WV WDA EEG. Gregg Dale seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed and none abstained.

4. Phase IIIA Sewer Project

Zack informed the Board that he had the 14th Payment Request for the Phase IIIA Sewer Collection System Upgrades Project. After discussion, Connor Thompson made a motion to approve Resolution #14 for the Phase IIIA Sewer Collection Upgrades Project, with \$2,135.00 going to Sun Valley PSD Reimbursement, for a grand total of \$2,135.00 to be submitted to Harrison County ARPA. Gregg Dale seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed and none abstained.

5. Thrasher Engineering Progress Report

Cody Turner gave the Board a progress report on the construction.

Phase IIIA – Cody and Kevin informed the Board that they started Smoke Testing on Monday, so we can get IIIA closed out. Kevin said they did Liberty Middle School and Mountaineer Elementary School and the Football Complex and the Baseball field. Kevin said they found a few issues, but nothing major and most of it being on their end. Today, they did Skana Aluminum and a section over on Sun Valley Road and a little section in Wolf Summit. Kevin said on Wednesday they will be smoke testing from RD Wilson and they will be concentrating on the area clear through to Chiefton. Then, on Thursday and Friday they will be doing approximately 27 customers on the far end of Lake Floyd. Zack Dobbins said that the smoke testing cost \$14,000.00 and there is still \$11,000.00 on the County Commission that Thrasher Engineering has a bill for finishing up on Construction stuff. Zack said we still have \$39,000.00 left, but if you remember Wayne said do not come back asking for anything, but after we get finished, if there is anything left, Zack will go back and ask. Kevin said we have to be careful, as it has to be Project related or Infrastructure. Zack and Kevin and the Board continued discussion on how to use the remaining funds.

Phase IIIB – Cody said we are 308 days into Contract Time Elapsed; 439 days to Substantial Completion which is February 21, 2026 and 469 days to Final Completion which is March 23, 2026. As of September 19, 2025 we are about 3 weeks behind schedule, but even with those weeks included, he feels we are 60% to 65% completed. Cody said they will continue laying 8" SDR 35 upstream of Davisson Run Road and working towards Liberty High School. They will finish spur lines on Old Davisson Run and then they will move to Fletcher Heights.

Indian Run — Zack informed the Board that we got the Binding Commitment from WVIJDC for the Indian Run Water Line Extension Project. Zack said this was the last thing they needed and Cody got the form filled out and it was submitted yesterday. Zack said they have the Health Department permit which by-passes the specs, etc. so you don't have to do anything when they get to this. Zack said that they don't have the letter yet, but based on what they saw when they go onto their website it has already got it ready for the first draw to start submitting for reimbursement, so that is a good sign. Zack and Cody believe that we will have some final documentation in the next week or two. Cody said there is a meeting on October 28, 2025 with the Infrastructure and they plan on being at this meeting. Kevin informed the Mazer's that they need to get the ROW's signed and notarized and brought back to the office as soon as possible. Doug Mazer said that he would drop them off in the morning. The Mazer's asked if it is possible to get started on the Line Extension by spring and Kevin said hopefully, but it depends on how bad of a winter we have. Zack and Cody and the Board continued discussion on the proceedings.

6. Manager's Report

A. Kevin provided the Board with copies of the Delinquency report that includes Lake Floyd PSD

- and Sun Valley PSD sewer showing the total amounts still past due before charges were created on September 26, 2025 and discussed.
- **B.** Kevin provided the Board with copies of the Water and Sewer Bond Payment Schedule and advised the Board that all of the Bond payments are paid to date.
- C. Kevin provided the Board with a copy of the Water Loss Report for July 2025 through June 2026. Kevin informed the Board that we had a Water Loss of 23.29% for the month of September, 2025. He said that we have a 19.22% adjusted Water Loss for FY 2025-2026. Kevin and the Board discussed this in detail.
- **D.** Kevin provided the Board with a copy of the Water and Sewer spreadsheets that show the total amount billed compared to the total amount purchased for the month of September, 2025 and discussed.
- E. Kevin provided the Board with a copy of the Vendor Invoice Report dated 09/30/25, for Sun Valley PSD Water & Sewer and discussed.
- F. Kevin provided the Board with copies of October and November calendar's and discussed.
- G. Kevin informed the Board that he told Steve Turner that he wanted him to get the Lake Floyd PSD bank accounts closed down and get the checks to us, so we can get them in our bank account and move forward. Kevin said there is still some DEP things that are not closed out, but we can't close it out because we don't have access to their administrative system at the DEP. Kevin said the DEP would not talk to us because Lake Floyd PSD has an outstanding dredging permit and another permit. The DEP does not send you a bill until after the permit is a year old. Kevin and the Board continued discussion on closing out Lake Floyd PSD.
- H. Kevin informed the Board that an executive director from 811 (Miss Utility) stopped in at the office last week and informed us that Lake Floyd PSD has not paid their 811 bill for over a year. Since Lake Floyd PSD does not exist anymore, we at Sun Valley PSD is responsible to pay the bill. The director said that we have to remove Lake Floyd PSD from our map and delete it. He said you can't get access to it for 1 (one) day until you first pay the bill. The total cost was \$279.00, so we paid their bill. The next day, the director showed up again and this time he gave Cathy an email password and login to their system. We then had to go in and close out all of Lake Floyd PSD's Miss Utilities and transfer them to Sun Valley PSD.

7. Next Board Meeting

Connor Thompson announced that the next Board meeting would be November 11, 2025.

8. Adjournment

There being no further business, Connor Thompson made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Gregg Dale seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed and none abstained.
