At the regular meeting of the County Commission of Harrison County held on Wednesday January 5, 2022, Commissioners Susan J. Thomas, David Hinkle and Patsy Trecost II were present. Also present were Micah Fisher, Deputy Clerk, and Laura Pysz, County Administrator. Commissioner Thomas opened the meeting and led those present in prayer. Thomas led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. All motions passed unanimously unless otherwise noted.

10:05 A.M. --- Public Hearing --- Regarding the Supplemental Application for Charles Pointe Economic Opportunity Development District in Harrison County Known as and Designated as the "Charles Pointe Opportunity Development District" (the "District") to Permit Obligations Issued by the County Commission for Funding Projects in the District ("Financing Obligations") to have Terms of 30 Years from the Date of Issuance of Such /Financing Obligations, and Establish December 31, 2052 as the Date on which the District Shall Terminate - President Thomas opened the public hearing for public comment. Hinkle asked for clarification on the bonds and the terms of the bonds. Aman discussed what has happened to date and what will potentially take place in the future. Senator Mike Romano spoke about the extension, refinancing, TIF bonds, and potential new development. Mike Jenkins from Harrison County Development Authority and Carpenters Union, spoke in favor of the project. Jim Christie, spoke about history of Charles Pointe and expressed his support. Rob Stewart, director of Planning and Development of Genesis Partners, stated that he strongly supported the supplemental application. Trecost made a motion to close hearing. Thomas closed the hearing and moved to item #14.

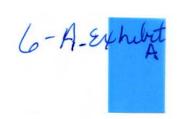

### Special Meeting Minutes of the Greater Harrison County Public Service District For Wednesday, November 3, 2021

#### Agenda Items:

- 1. To conduct a public hearing regarding a proposed Water Rate Resolution
- 2. To consider on second reading and act upon a proposed Water Rate Resolution, as amended, entitled:

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING NEW RATES, FEES AND CHARGES FOR SERVICE TO CUSTOMERS OF THE EXISTING PUBLIC WATERWORKS SYSTEM OF GREATER HARRISON COUNTY PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICT.

#### Public Comments:

Delby B. Pool – as I understand this notice it reads there will be an 8.81 increase in two steps, ½ to go into effect as soon as approved and ½ 6 months later. What specifically will this cover? Zack added one of our big problems right now is pipe, it is hard to get and pipe as well as fittings has had an increase in the cost. We have hired another additional employee. Another big issue we purchase water from the City of Nutter Fort and they just increased their rates 14%, so that was almost \$50,000 O&M increase. Delby inquired if there are any large loans this is being addressed to? Zack replied "no, this is just helping us meet our bond covenants, because at the fiscal year end we were in a \$78,000 deficit. This will help us to fund our renewal and replacement account. Delby inquired approximately how many customers are water or water/sewer that this would impact? Zack replied a little over 3500 customers, a then the other item built in is the truck fund of \$25,000 per year, we have trucks with over 200,000 miles and it becomes a safety concern.

Jeanette Paugh – I am retired and live on a fixed income, you all keep raising the rates and we don't get no raise on the social security like this. I don't use 600-800 galloons per month, but I pay the same as someone that uses 3500 gallons a month. If I'm gonna pay for 3500 gallons of water then I might as well put it in a tank somewhere. I think that should be taken into consideration when you keep raising this stuff.

Carol McConnell - Nothing to add

Richard Fowler – What I have to say is I'm looking at a paper here that says 3500 gallons and the present rate is 38.47. If this was presented to the County Commission I'm questioning why

it was presented that way, mine is \$33.00. Zack added what we are required to advertise is what the average customer uses. Dick restated but it was presented to the County Commission the way it is showing here not what your minimum rate is. What your minimum rate is today is 3000 gallons for \$33.00 a month. Are we playing smoking mirrors here or what? This letter shows my present rate is \$38.47 for 3500 gallons and that is not what it is. Zack added that is for the average customer and for a 3500-gallon bill is that, you will see in the last sentence of the first paragraph the average monthly bill for the various classes of water customers will change as follows. So, it is just the average, not specific people. When we presented this to the County Commission we provided what the average bill was, a minimum bill and every tariff section. Dick stated, so what I'm still saying is your minimum billing today mine is 3000 gallons \$33.00, so why was it not presented this way. Zack added because we are not required interrupted by Dick - Dick stated you are not required to tell the truth right. Todd Swanson added the PSC required – interrupted by Dick – Dick stated that the Public Service Commission has nothing to do with the rates! Let's get that straight right now. Todd Swanson stated with the form they do, Zack added what we presented was an average bill. Dick added why didn't you show it as a residential present rate 3000 gallons \$33.00, Zack added that is a minimum bill not an average bill. Dick added, I've made by comment "smoking mirrors is all I'm saying".

Janice Stout - We the customers can't be a blank check for whatever they want money for, it seems like every year you want more and more from us the customers. I like the idea like she said living alone and only doing 2 loads of laundry a week, I should pay much less using considerably much less. I would also like to know who provides accountability and oversite of the operations of Greater Harrison, I don't know that? I don't know who comes in and looks objectively at are you running efficiently and effectively at running. I have experience is that area, have you done process mapping, what are the results? Have you done process improvement projects? Who does those? What's the results of those? Have you done cost analysis? Do you know what the processing cost is? Have you done metrics to make reduce cost or make more efficient. I don't know who does this for Greater Harrison and I would be interested in knowing who does. Zack replied; Your talking about a district that is taking care of about 6000 customers, about 14 employees, we have folks with the average person may make \$30,000 per year with overtime. Bill the General Manager looks at pipe prices, there are only certain places we can get pipe. We buy fuel in bulk to get cheaper costs, they have outsourced the accounting to me, this is not a normal business! We do have another person at the office that works part time and she has oversight over the office, takes control of billing and uploads actual deposits. Janice added with all the things you mentioned are either buying supplies or salaries, I'm not talking about that. I'm talking about administrative processes, work processes, has anyone mapped those out to see what it cost to do each step to see where you could make cuts. Zack added there is no process, when there's a water leak we have to fix it! To cut down on the leaks that we fix there is no way to do that, we have changed meters from manual to radio to save time and reallocate time. Bill added, we started about 10 years ago with satellite telemetry, and again we did a cost analysis on that, our tanks had to be checked all the time manually/physically. We can now look at this now on our iPhone or etc., we did look at the cost savings per year, we did the same thing with the manual read meters. I used to take 3 weeks to read all the meters, now we do that in 4 days. Our biggest issue is

water loss, we try to identify areas - we bought a Beacon system. Where are you? Janice replied at the top of Johnstown Hill, I have asked repeatedly for someone to come and talk to me to find a solution. I know my uncle signed a waiver but I have a fabulous home and a trickle of water. We have a water trough master meter - we know how many customers we have, we know how much water they use and by these steps we have cut down water loss, we can identify when something is wrong. Janice stated that she has a pump. Bill advised her that he would discuss with her later. Tom added that there was a low-pressure waiver signed, you will have to have a pump - interrupted by Janice. Tom concluded that who pays for the pump, that would be you! Tom ask Bill to please contact her. The pumps should have a low pressure shut off switch. All the people in Locust Heights they know and they all have a low pressure shut off switch. We can record the pressure and advise you what the minimum is and you can adjust your low-pressure switch. Tom stated your first question, you were wondering is an expert has ever taken a look at your whole system. Janice added that I literally saved \$100's of \$1000's of dollars. I don't believe we have ever had a person come in just to do that, however it happens constantly that we are seeking advise or have questions and it turns into improvements in efficiency. The PSC is very good and every month the County Commission gets reports on financial information which they review, there is oversight in all areas. The PSC assists with leaks, hydraulic problems etc. Tom added that they are good about educating and reeducating.

Cynthia Woolford – I just wanted to be informed and I really don't have any questions.

The public comment period was concluded.

The resolution to establish new rate was read "A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING NEW RATES, FEES AND CHARGES FOR SERVICE TO CUSTOMERS OF THE EXISTING PUBLIC WATERWORKS SYSTEM OF GREATER HARRISON COUNTY PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICT".

Thomas Michael added on the minimum bill issue, some of the information discussed with the state-wide average for minimum residential consumption is 3500. Zack added no, this is Greater Harrison's, statewide is 3400. Tom added so our minimum bill is less than the average already, is there anyway you could deal with the people that use 600 galloons per month. Zack added that we would have to go back and do statewide and working for over 100 utilities statewide, if the board wanted to lower that minimum then we have to go back through and do bill analysis for rule 42. We can look at this and see what we can do, however at the end of the day when we need 3 million dollars, we need 3 million dollars. ? questioned has anyone looked at the load, do you have a cluster of people using 600 gallons. Zack added yes this will be reviewed and submitted with the next water project. ? questioned if there are alternate sources for purchasing water versus Nutter Fort? Zack added unfortunately that is not an option, we have agreements and bond payments that prohibit changing.

**Meeting Minutes for November:** Mark Leonard made a motion approve the November meeting minutes, seconded by Ruth Ann Messenger and unanimously accepted.

Sewer Project

#### Phase 2 Rt. 73 – Construction Updates

The last foot of pipe went into the ground today on Rt. 73. No reclaimed or tested but every foot of pipe is in the ground. Pictures and construction updates are available. They are hoping to get the testing done the next couple of days and a walk through done next Wednesday. This work includes the work change directive for Tom Kennedy. The construction does still need some paving and reclamation. The road work was done by Wolfe Excavating and photos are also available. This was a significant slip on the road. We were able to strike a deal with the airport to get some shot rock to build road back up. This access road has been a problem since the first couple months of construction. In November of 2020 we had the site drilled and monitored it continually. The cost of estimates leads us to go back to the USDA for more funds. The total cost has not yet come in from Wolfe Excavating. They would have been finished up last week but they noticed some sponging at the entrance of the road. They took off about 2' off the top of the road and put on shot rock in. Everything has been stabilized at this time. The cost for 3 bore holes is about \$15,000. Mr. Wilfong is aware that they will be paving now. We are responsible for putting \$1,000 a year for any future road work, he is responsible for his snow removal and we are responsible for ours. We have ingress egress through there. Zack added that if Mr. Wilfong would start to build back there then we need to have pictures of slip and before and after for any potential problems. Patrick can keep an eye out for other activity on the access road.

We have put together a Sludge Press spec, verified with USDA just to be able to submit to suppliers. This doesn't have to be vendor bid. We have already received calls of interest. Charlotte Wells has advised that we do not have to advertise under the federal standards. The equipment is unique. Zack added that he believes we did this in 2015 with the meters. Charlotte advised that we only have to submit to quotes. This has been sent to five suppliers now. If you have to put in the paper, it would be close to \$1,500 plus.

We have a change order for contract #3, change order #5 for the work change order directive due to line 30. This was the contaminated soil; we have to change a line. They started construction on May 25<sup>th</sup> and completed on September 8<sup>th</sup>, a total of 106 days. We had to change the way the services were coming in. Together was 117 days which moved the final completion date from January into May, then I accounted for the weather days making the total day addition up to 120 days. They ask for 128 days.

The additional money is \$88,739, this includes \$23,623 for mobilization, remobilization, \$696 for polywrap, Mr. Kennedy required a £1 grinder pump for \$35,649, an additional 445 linear foot of forced main for \$1,181. The total increase is \$88,739.00 Now total contract \$6,560,544.00. Take the substantial completion day to 629 calendar days and final payment days to 659 days. This takes the substantial complete to May 27, 2021. They are still 7 months out of contract time. A motion to approve Change order #5 for Contract #3 was made by Mark Leonard, seconded by James Scudere and unanimously accepted.

Notice of Acceptability of Work on Contract #4 is just paperwork basically. This is the waste water treatment plant contract with Breckenridge, we need a motion to accept the work. A motion to accept was made by Thomas Michael, seconded by Ray Vanhorn and unanimously accepted.

Notice of Acceptability of Contract #1 was previously made but with the road work this will include the road work. A motion to accept was made by James Scudere, seconded by Mark Leonard and unanimously accepted.

We will have to work on the additional costs now with the damages and delays associated with the contract. They have significantly caused increased cost due to delay. I have kept a running list for costs associated with this.

#### **Enterprise**

They are at 71% complete currently. They have 3 crews working right now. Indications from contractor they will be adding 2-3 crews mid-January. There have been no major complaints. They have had mostly questions. The lines are being tested as they are doing the work. As soon as the digging crews get done the testing crews come in. They are making good progress.

#### Sludge Removal Project

We are progressing through the design; I have a few questions I need to get with Bill on. This is a fully funded project.

#### **Quiet Dell**

We got the additional planning waste load allocation from the DEP. Showing them, we were taking out six package plants, this did boost our numbers a little bit. We can look at getting them out to suppliers now. We have a map for your review, we did find a treatment plant location with an access road. We will look at the possibility of securing property before we do too much additional. The property belongs to Andy Lang. He is willing but the access road will be more difficult. I would like to get something more formal from the County before we do too much and expenses add up. James Scudere added that they need to make a written commitment.

#### **Woodstock Heights Sanitary Sewer Extension Project**

We submitted a planning document utilizing the rates where they are right now. We would look to fund about a 1 million project, \$500,000 grant from UDC and \$500,000 in debt forgiveness the DEP. It would be minimum flow with only about 18 homes and the winery. Construction costs would be about \$750,000. It won't be reviewed by the council until mid-January.

#### 10-year plan

#### **Water Projects**

#### Steven's Run

Spoke with contractor on Tuesday and still waiting on pipe. The 6" should be shipped by end of January, the 4" should be manufactured first of February. There has been delays with the booster station as well.

#### **Overall Water Project**

We are working on the planning document, February submission expected. We have been working with Zack on this.

#### **Locust Heights**

We did not get the funds. We have an idea and would like to meet with the County and if they could give us about \$250,000. Perhaps we could match with IJDC. This really cannot wait.

#### Finance: Report provided by Ruth Ann Messenger

Water and Sewer check registers with debit card transactions

- -Water- Total amount for checks \$117,663.10. This includes with 2 Eft's, first check #8350 thru 8370.
- -Sewer- Total amount for checks and EFT's: \$289,620.31. This includes 10 Eft's, first check #34581 thru 34641.

Debit card transactions totaled \$491.53. A motion to approve was made by James Scudere, seconded by Thomas Michael and unanimously accepted.

#### Zack Dobbins - Bennett and Dobbins

In the water there was a large bill to Steptoe and Johnson, about half was for services and the other half was all the advertisements. On the sewer side there was a check to Matheny Motors for \$75,000, we had to pay for that upfront but we will get reimbursed for that. The landfill revenue will have a big impact but I'm hoping with these projects it will help make up some of that revenue.

We have Drawdown Resolution #30 for Phase II/Rt. 73 in the amount of \$256,855.28. That will be paid out of SRF loan \$1,630.00, USDA loan \$109,203.51 and USDA grant \$146,021.77. A motion to approve Draw #30 made by Thomas Michael, seconded by Ray Vanhorn and unanimously accepted. The dump truck will also help to take some of the sludge out.

We have Resolution #16 for the Enterprise project in the amount of \$210,455.55 on the SRF loan. A motion to approve Resolution #16 made by Thomas Michael, seconded by James Scudere and unanimously accepted.

Last month you selected JD Utility Services to do the county wide water project, I have that contract in the amount of \$100,000. These were submitted to Sam and his only question was on the format on the scope of services. A motion to approve the contract was made by Thomas Michael, seconded by Ray Vanhorn and unanimously accepted.

Each year Bennett and Dobbins has to have an agreement signed for the day-to-day work done for Greater Harrison, this is billed on a monthly charge. To continue with our services for calendar year 2022 we need a motion. A motion was made by Thomas Michael, seconded by Ray Vanhorn and unanimously accepted.

In speaking with Sam on the Woodstock Heights, the administration would be \$10,000 fee and he agreed that this does not need to be bid out. This would be the same scope of services contract that you approved for the water project. A motion to approve was made by Thomas Michael, seconded by James Scudere and unanimously accepted.

With the scope of services being approved, I now have the acknowledge of uniform bidding procedures for projects recommended by the WV infrastructure jobs development council for the Wood Stock Heights project. This is the same as you signed last month for the water project, we have to do this for each project. A motion to approve was made by Mark Leonard, seconded by James Scudere and unanimously accepted.

I also need a motion to sign the proposed customer certification and agreement for the WV IJDC project for the Wood Stock Heights. The number of customers to be served is zero, this is just for improvements. A motion to approve was made by James Scudere, seconded by Ruth Ann Messenger and unanimously accepted.

Last month we spoke about the senate bill 234 and opening up separate accounts for water and sewer, Bill has gotten all that paperwork ready. We just need a motion to approve signing setting up the separate accounts for water and sewer for senate bill 234. A motion to approve was made by James Scudere, seconded by Ruth Ann Messenger and unanimously accepted.

#### Bill Hoover - General Manager

Water – Lost Creek/Mount Clare we maintained at 39%, one main leak and 3 service lines. Valley of Good Hope was at 13% no leaks. QD was at 11% down a lot and we fixed no leaks. Overall, 22% down 7%. The PSC has come in a couple different times and helped us sound for leaks. There are 3 areas we are going to look at.

Coon's Run was at 15%. It is really not a bad system.

We did get water violations. If you call the Health Department, they say it's a Lab problem. We sit at the fax for a couple hours at a time. This issue is not just with Greater Harrison. You have to fax the documents. It has come to the point everyone is frustrated. We want to get the cabinet secretary to come and talk to us. I'm not sure just how many violations we have had. I delegate all of this to Matt.

All the meters have been changed out in Coon's Run except one which will be a little more difficult.

Weather has not affected us yet. No meter bottoms have busted and no frozen lines.

In the County Commission today they had a representative from WV American Water, he mentioned that they can buy struggling water systems and he then ended up with purchasing Greater Harrison County PSD. They want to be the sole supplier of water in WV. It is really not up to us. Zack added that their rates are higher than ours. They just got into sewer, their tariffs are hard to read and find. I can't image them wanting to do these 30-million-dollar projects. Their rates are raised every year.

#### Sewer

We have been trying to work on lift station #15 for 3 months. We had to order parts and have been waiting 90 days. Our guys are going over daily to check but it scheduled for repair tomorrow.

Finished all our septic tank pumping for the season. There was one we had to contract out to M&M because we didn't have enough hoses.

Jim and I did go to the sanitary board in Shinnston. It was a good meeting and we made some steps. I contacted Cathy Emery, we were concerned and we inquired on if Shinnston could take some of this waste water? She will get back to me after she reviews. We explained the direction we want to go in.

I would like to sit down with the County Administrator but with the holidays it's been difficult.

#### Good of the District

We need to send a letter of support to County Commission to reappoint board members. James Scudere made a motion to reappoint Thomas Michael, Ruth Ann Messenger and Ray Vanhorn to the board of Greater Harrison County PSD, seconded by Ruth Ann Messenger and unanimously accepted.

#### Patrick Lesmann – (P&B Services)

No issues Patrick maintains the day to day and we are down to only 4.

Executive Session - To discuss Route 73.

# Harrison County WV Commission FOIA Policy & Fee Schedule

Effective 1/26/2022

#### 1. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to standardize the procedures within the Harrison County Commission (Commission) associated with processing Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests, except as otherwise directed by the County Administrator.

#### 2. Scope

This policy applies to all employees of the Commission and any individual or organization charged with producing Commission FOIA responses and contracted organizations and individuals as their contracts may require compliance with this policy or Commission policies.

#### 3. Applicable W. Va. Code / List of Exemptions

West Virginia Code, Chapter 29B, "Freedom of Information" (Appendix A)

#### 4. Definitions

The definitions below are applicable unless the context in which the defined words are used clearly requires a different meaning.

- Addressee: The person to whom the FOIA Request is addressed. All FOIA Requests should be submitted using the Harrison County WV Commission's Freedom of Information Request form (via email or mail) to the County Administrator.
- Legal Counsel: An attorney or law firm designated by the County Commission.
- Record: "Public Record" includes any writing containing information prepared or received by a public body, the content or context of which, judged either by content or context, relates to the conduct of the public's business. "Writing" includes any books, papers, maps, photographs, cards, tapes, recordings, or other documentary materials regardless of physical form or characteristics.
- Request: A request that is submitted to the County Administrator using the Commission's
   Freedom of Information Request form or in such other format as maybe acceptable to the

County Administrator. A Harrison County Commission Freedom of Information Request form should be completed for every request and kept on file.

Requester: The person requesting a FOIA response.

#### 5. Dispositions of a FOIA Request

The disposition of a FOIA request may be resolved by:

- Notifying the Requester that the Request lacks reasonable specificity for fulfillment;
- Notifying the Requester that the requested Records are not possessed by the Commission;
- Notifying the Requester where the requested Records may be obtained from the Commission's website or other websites if the information is already in existence in a public forum;
- Notifying the Requester of the time and place at which he or she may inspect and request copies
  of Records. Responses to such Requests will be in accordance with the law and, except where it
  may be inapplicable, this policy. Consult Legal Counsel if guidance is needed;
- Furnishing copies of the requested Records in accordance with the law and this policy;
- Responding to the Requester, as provided in Section 6 of this policy, when the requested Records are relevant to a suit or grievance against the Commission; or
- Denying the Request, in whole or in part, and providing the Requester with a written statement containing the information in Section 7 of this policy. A copy of the denial shall be maintained in the office of the County Commission for retention for one year, unless law or other policy requires a longer period.

#### 6. Time to Respond to a FOIA Request; Request for Extension Time to Respond

 A response fulfilling or denying a FOIA Request or reasons why the FOIA request may not be provided must be made within five days of receipt of the Request Form by the County Administrator, not including the day of receipt, Saturdays, Sunday, and legal holidays.

#### Request for Extension

- If the Commission determines that the requested Records cannot be retrieved and copied before the response is due, the County Administrator:
  - Processes the Request in conformance with this policy;
  - Attempts to contact by telephone or email the Requester to:
    - Provide any fee information required by Section 8;
    - Explain why the response cannot be timely prepared;
    - Provide an estimated time when the response will be ready, and
    - If the request for an extension is refused, proceed to provide the response as soon as practicable.
- Sends a letter or email to the Requester documenting any telephone conversation, including any fee information.

 If there was no telephone or email reply, sends a letter to the Requester containing the information and request that would have been provided in the telephone call.

#### 7. Processing of Requests Received by the County Administrator

FOIA Requests should be addressed to the County Administrator, as the sole Addressee:

- If the Request is related to a potentially controversial or sensitive matter, the County
   Administrator sends a copy of the Request (or forwards the email or voicemail) to Legal Counsel,
   if the Requester did not address or copy them.
- o If it is known that the requested Records relate to a suit or grievance against the Commission, the County Administrator hand-delivers or faxes a copy of the Request (or forwards the email or voicemail) to the attorney defending the Commission and inquires if a FOIA response should be prepared or whether the attorney will respond as part of the suit or grievance.
- If the Request is routine, it may require Legal Counsel to approve the response when it is prepared; and, as appropriate, the County Administrator consults with him or her regarding:
- The drafting of the response letter and any Records that may be exempt from disclosure under the West Virginia FOIA, W. Va. Code 29B-1-4, other provision of law, court orders, or court recognized privileges, such as attorney-client attorney work-product, deliberative process, etc.; and
- o If the response will be a denial of the Request, in whole or in part, inclusion of statements that notify the Requester:
  - The reasons for the denial. (The Commission is not required to prepare a Vaughn index, which lists all of the records that the Commission is not producing due to the applicable exemptions. In Farley v. Worley, 215 W. Va. 412, 599 S.E.2d 835 (2004), the Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia made this distinction clear. "In other words, the Vaughn index is implicated by FOIA litigation not by a FOIA denial." ID., at 426, 849.)
  - That the Requester may institute proceedings in the Circuit Court of the jurisdiction where the Records are kept, i.e., the Circuit Court of Harrison County, West Virginia.
- Makes an estimate of the fee to be charged based on the fees established in Section 8 of this policy;
- Takes the following action when the estimated fee is more than \$5.00 and the Requester did not include in his or her Request an agreement to pay an amount equal to or greater than the estimated fee:
- o Attempts to telephone or email the Requester to inform him or her:
  - Of the estimated fee and requests agreement of the Requester to pay that fee;
  - That the exact fee will be communicated to him; or
  - That no copies of Records will be released until the fee is paid; and
- Sends a letter or email to the Requester to:

- Confirm any agreement of the Requester to pay the estimated fee; or
- If the Requester refused to pay the fee, or if there was no telephone conversation or email reply, inform the Requester of the estimated fee and that nothing further will be done regarding the Request until the Agency receives agreement to pay the estimated fee.
- Determines the exact fee in accordance with Section 8 of this policy;
- Drafts the response letter and obtains the review and approval of the Response by Legal Counsel, unless he or she has stated that such is not necessary.
- Signs the response letter or requests Legal Counsel to sign it;
- Telephones or email the Requester (or, if the Requester cannot be reached by telephone, sends
  a letter) and informs him or her of the fee and that the response to the Request will be held until
  payment is received by check or money order made payable to Harrison County Commission;
  and
- When the fee is received, sends the fee to County Clerk, mails or emails the response to the Requester, and files a complete copy of the response for one year, unless law or other policy requires a longer period.

#### **APPENDIX A**

#### **WEST VIRGINIA CODE**

#### CHAPTER 29B. FREEDOM OF INFORMATION.

#### § 29B-1-1. Declaration of policy.

Pursuant to the fundamental philosophy of the American constitutional form of representative government which holds to the principle that government is the servant of the people, and not the master of them, it is hereby declared to be the public policy of the State of West Virginia that all persons are, unless otherwise expressly provided by law, entitled to full and complete information regarding the affairs of government and the official acts of those who represent them as public officials and employees. The people, in delegating authority, do not give their public servants the right to decide what is good for the people to know and what is not good for them to know. The people insist on remaining informed so that they may retain control over the instruments of government they have created. To that end, the provisions of this article shall be liberally construed with the view of carrying out the above declaration of public policy.

#### § 29B-1-2. Definitions.

As used in this article:

- (1) "Custodian" means the elected or appointed official charged with administering a public body.
- (2) "Law-enforcement officer" shall have the same definition as this term is defined in <u>W.Va. Code §30-29-1</u>: Provided, That for purposes of this article, "law-enforcement officer" shall additionally include those individuals defined as "chief executive" in W.Va. Code §30-29-1.
- (3) "Person" includes any natural person, corporation, partnership, firm or association.
- (4) "Public body" means every state officer, agency, department, including the executive, legislative and judicial departments, division, bureau, board and commission; every county and city governing body, school district, special district, municipal corporation, and any board, department, commission council or agency thereof; and any other body which is created by state or local authority or which is primarily funded by the state or local authority.
- (5) "Public record" includes any writing containing information prepared or received by a public body, the content or context of which, judged either by content or context, relates to the conduct of the public's business.
- (6) "Writing" includes any books, papers, maps, photographs, cards, tapes, recordings or other documentary materials regardless of physical form or characteristics.
- (7) "Publicly-administered utility enterprise" includes electric power generation, transmission, and distribution systems; water supply and distribution systems; wastewater including stormwater collection, treatment, and disposal systems of all types; public transportation systems; solid waste collection and disposal systems and facilities; or other public entity providing utility services, excluding airports, which are owned or administered by a governmental entity.

### § 29B-1-3. Inspection and copying of public record; requests of Freedom of Information Act requests registry.

(a) Every person has a right to inspect or copy any public record of a public body in this state, except as otherwise expressly provided by section four [ $\S$  29B-1-4] of this article.

- (b) A request to inspect or copy any public record of a public body shall be made directly to the custodian of such public record.
- (c) The custodian of any public records, unless otherwise expressly provided by statute, shall furnish proper and reasonable opportunities for inspection and examination of the records in his or her office and reasonable facilities for making memoranda or abstracts therefrom, during the usual business hours, to all persons having occasion to make examination of them. The custodian of the records may make reasonable rules and regulations necessary for the protection of the records and to prevent interference with the regular discharge of his or her duties. If the records requested exist in magnetic, electronic or computer form, the custodian of the records shall make copies available on magnetic or electronic media, if so requested.
- (d) All requests for information must state with reasonable specificity the information sought. The custodian, upon demand for records made under this statute, shall as soon as is practicable but within a maximum of five days not including Saturdays, Sundays or legal holidays: (1) Furnish copies of the requested information; (2) Advise the person making the request of the time and place at which he or she may inspect and copy the materials; or (3) Deny the request stating in writing the reasons for such denial. A denial shall indicate that the responsibility of the custodian of any public records or public body to produce the requested records or documents is at an end, and shall afford the person requesting them the opportunity to institute proceedings for injunctive or declaratory relief in the circuit court in the county where the public record is kept.
- (e) The public body may establish fees reasonably calculated to reimburse it for its actual cost in making reproductions of records. A public body may not charge a search or retrieval fee or otherwise seek reimbursement based on a man-hour basis as part of costs associated with making reproduction of records.
- (f) The Secretary of State shall maintain an electronic data base of notices of requests as required by section three-a [§ 29B-1-3a] of this article. The database shall be made available to the public via the Internet and shall list each freedom of information request received and the outcome of the request. The Secretary of State shall provide on the website a form for use by a public body to report the results of the freedom of information request, providing the nature of the request and the public body's response thereto, whether the request was granted, and if not, the exemption asserted under section four of this article to deny the request.

#### § 29B-1-3a. Reports to Secretary of State by public bodies.

- (a) Beginning January 1, 2016, each public body that is in receipt of a freedom of information request shall provide information to the Secretary of State relating to, at a minimum, the nature of the request, the nature of the public body's response, the time-frame that was necessary to comply in full with the request; and the amount of reimbursement charged to the requester for the freedom of information request: Provided, That the public body shall not provide to the Secretary of State the public records that were the subject of the FOIA request.
- (b) Pursuant to article three [§§ 29A-3-1] et seq.], chapter twenty-nine-a of this code, the Secretary of State shall propose rules and emergency rules for legislative approval relating to the creation and maintenance of a publically accessible database available on the Secretary of State's website; the establishment of forms and procedures for submission of information to the Secretary of State by the public body; and for other procedures and policies consistent with this section.

#### § 29B-1-4. Exemptions.

(a) There is a presumption of public accessibility to all public records, subject only to the following categories of information which are specifically exempt from disclosure under this article:

- (1) Trade secrets, as used in this section, which may include, but are not limited to, any formula, plan, pattern, process, tool, mechanism, compound, procedure, production data, or compilation of information which is not patented which is known only to certain individuals within a commercial concern who are using it to fabricate, produce, or compound an article or trade or a service or to locate minerals or other substances, having commercial value, and which gives its users an opportunity to obtain business advantage over competitors;
- (2) Information of a personal nature such as that kept in a personal, medical, or similar file, if the public disclosure of the information would constitute an unreasonable invasion of privacy, unless the public interest by clear and convincing evidence requires disclosure in this particular instance: Provided, That this article does not preclude an individual from inspecting or copying his or her own personal, medical, or similar file;
- (3) Test questions, scoring keys, and other examination data used to administer a licensing examination, examination for employment, or academic examination;

(4)

- (A) Records of law-enforcement agencies that deal with the detection and investigation of crime and the internal records and notations of such law-enforcement agencies which are maintained for internal use in matters relating to law enforcement:
- (B) Records identifying motor vehicles used, and the agencies using them, for undercover investigation activities conducted by state law-enforcement agencies or other agencies that are authorized by this code to use undercover or unmarked vehicles;
- (5) Information specifically exempted from disclosure by statute;
- (6) Records, archives, documents, or manuscripts describing the location of undeveloped historic, prehistoric, archaeological, paleontological, and battlefield sites or constituting gifts to any public body upon which the donor has attached restrictions on usage or the handling of which could irreparably damage the record, archive, document, or manuscript;
- (7) Information contained in or related to examination, operating or condition reports prepared by, or on behalf of, or for the use of any agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions, except those reports which are by law required to be published in newspapers;
- (8) Internal memoranda or letters received or prepared by any public body;
- (9) Records assembled, prepared, or maintained to prevent, mitigate, or respond to terrorist acts or the threat of terrorist acts, the public disclosure of which threaten the public safety or the public health;
- (10) Those portions of records containing specific or unique vulnerability assessments or specific or unique response plans, data, databases and inventories of goods or materials collected or assembled to respond to terrorist acts; and communication codes or deployment plans of law-enforcement or emergency response personnel;
- (11) Specific intelligence information and specific investigative records dealing with terrorist acts or the threat of a terrorist act shared by and between federal and international law-enforcement agencies, state and local law-enforcement, and other agencies within the Department of Homeland Security;
- (12) National security records classified under federal executive order and not subject to public disclosure under federal law that are shared by federal agencies and other records related to national security briefings to assist state and local government with domestic preparedness for acts of terrorism;

- (13) Computing, telecommunications, and network security records, passwords, security codes, or programs used to respond to or plan against acts of terrorism which may be the subject of a terrorist act;
- (14) Security or disaster recovery plans, risk assessments, tests, or the results of those tests;
- (15) Architectural or infrastructure designs, maps, or other records that show the location or layout of the facilities where computing, telecommunications, or network infrastructure used to plan against or respond to terrorism are located or planned to be located;
- (16) Codes for facility security systems; or codes for secure applications for facilities referred to in subdivision (15) of this subsection;
- (17) Specific engineering plans and descriptions of existing public utility plants and equipment;
- (18) Customer proprietary network information of other telecommunications carriers, equipment manufacturers and individual customers, consistent with 47 U.S.C. §222;
- (19) Records of the Division of Corrections, Regional Jail and Correctional Facility Authority and the Division of Juvenile Services relating to design of corrections, jail and detention facilities owned or operated by the agency, and the policy directives and operational procedures of personnel relating to the safe and secure management of inmates or residents, that if released, could be used by an inmate or resident to escape a facility, or to cause injury to another inmate, resident, or to facility personnel;
- (20) Information related to applications under §61-7-4 of this code, including applications, supporting documents, permits, renewals, or any other information that would identify an applicant for or holder of a concealed weapon permit: Provided, That information in the aggregate that does not identify any permit holder other than by county or municipality is not exempted: Provided, however, That information or other records exempted under this subdivision may be disclosed to a law-enforcement agency or officer: (i) To determine the validity of a permit, (ii) to assist in a criminal investigation or prosecution, or (iii) for other lawful law-enforcement purposes;
- (21) Personal information of law-enforcement officers maintained by the public body in the ordinary course of the employer-employee relationship. As used in this paragraph, "personal information" means a law-enforcement officer's Social Security number, health information, home address, personal address, personal telephone numbers, and personal email addresses and those of his or her spouse, parents, and children as well as the names of the law-enforcement officer's spouse, parents, and children;
- (22) Information provided by a person when he or she elects to remain anonymous after winning a draw game prize, pursuant to §29-22-15a of this code; and
- (23) Individually identifiable customer information created or maintained by a city or county or other public entity providing utility services in connection with the ownership or operation of a publicly-administered utility enterprise, including, but not limited to, customer names, addresses, and billing and usage records. Nothing contained herein is intended to limit public disclosure by a city or county of billing information:
- (A) That the city or county determines will be useful or necessary to assist bond counsel, bond underwriters, underwriters' counsel, rating agencies or investors or potential investors in making informed decisions regarding bonds or other obligations incurred or to be incurred with respect to the publicly-administered utility enterprise;
- (B) That is necessary to assist the city, county, state, or public enterprise to maintain the integrity and quality of services it provides; or
- (C) That is necessary to assist law enforcement, public safety, fire protection, rescue, emergency management, or judicial officers in the performance of their duties.

- (b) As used in subdivisions (9) through (16), inclusive, subsection (a) of this section, the term "terrorist act" means an act that is likely to result in serious bodily injury or damage to property or the environment and is intended to:
- (1) Intimidate or coerce the civilian population;
- (2) Influence the policy of a branch or level of government by intimidation or coercion;
- (3) Affect the conduct of a branch or level of government by intimidation or coercion; or
- (4) Retaliate against a branch or level of government for a policy or conduct of the government.
- (c) The provisions of subdivisions (9) through (16), inclusive, subsection (a) of this section do not make subject to the provisions of this chapter any evidence of an immediate threat to public health or safety unrelated to a terrorist act or the threat of a terrorist act which comes to the attention of a public entity in the course of conducting a vulnerability assessment response or similar activity.

#### § 29B-1-5. Enforcement.

- (1) Any person denied the right to inspect the public record of a public body may institute proceedings for injunctive or declaratory relief in the circuit court in the county where the public record is kept.
- (2) In any suit filed under subsection one of this section, the court has jurisdiction to enjoin the custodian or public body from withholding records and to order the production of any records improperly withheld from the person seeking disclosure. The court shall determine the matter de novo and the burden is on the public body to sustain its action. The court, on its own motion, may view the documents in controversy in camera before reaching a decision. Any custodian of any public records of the public body found to be in noncompliance with the order of the court to produce the documents or disclose the information sought, may be punished as being in contempt of court.
- (3) Except as to causes the court considers of greater importance, proceedings arising under subsection one of this section shall be assigned for hearing and trial at the earliest practicable date.

#### § 29B-1-6. Violation of article; penalties.

Any custodian of any public records who willfully violates the provisions of this article is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than two hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars, or be imprisoned in the county jail for not more than twenty days, or, in the discretion of the court, by both fine and imprisonment.

#### § 29B-1-7. Attorney fees and costs.

Any person who is denied access to public records requested pursuant to this article and who successfully brings a suit filed pursuant to section five [§ 29B-1-5] of this article shall be entitled to recover his or her attorney fees and court costs from the public body that denied him or her access to the records.
